Following the Co-Creation workshop which took place in Malta (organised by our **UM** team) back in August, we gifted our student participants with vouchers to use at SCAN Ltd. a local computer and tech store. #### **ERASMUS Festival 2022**

On the 13th of October 2022, **CIP** participated in the **Erasmus+ Festival** in Plateia Eleftherias, Nicosia Cyprus. Joining in on a day of festivities and knowledge exchange, the STEM department had the opportunity to offer workshops on Digital Actions and more specifically the makers movement. Participants were introduced to the use of 3D printing technologies as a tool that can facilitate social innovation and were invited to discussions with our staff on the aims and objectives of the HEIDI project.

### **Smart Agriculture and Digital Action**

HEIDI's **CIP** team joined forces with the **PermaVET** and **AGRIcharisma** projects to introduce VET students in the school of Agriculture in Paralimni, Cyprus, the development possibilities offered by digital innovation and participation in digital actions in the field of smart agriculture. Smart sensors and microcontrollers for irrigation, agriculture gaming applications, and the utilisation of these in restructuring teams in agricultural production were some of the topics explored.



## "Walking Malta" took the streets!

It's been a busy few weeks for the **UM** HEIDI team! In September Dawra Madwarna, a local NGO, invited the HEIDI team to showcase a walkability app during a webinar that focused on local planning and place-making. App developer Dr Carlos Canas discussed how **Walking Malta** and Citizen Science could be used in a local context for monitoring areas of beauty and also areas that needed a bit more love and attention. The app is designed so that people may use an existing app, WhatsApp, to send images with hashtags to describe what their find while walking. The data is then populated on a map to show the walkability of localities.



During European Local Democracy week on 22nd Oct, the HEIDI team took to the streets in Senglea, Malta at a community gardening picnic. We showed people how to use the **Walking Malta app** to log images that showed areas of their locality that were safe and pleasant to walk about in, and areas that showed need of repair and cleaning. We found that locals were not aware of concepts such as Citizen Science but used WhatsApp regularly and therefore we were able to transfer knowledge on how to use Walking Malta easily and effectively. People were taken on mini tours of the streets they lived on and shown how to capture and send the images.

## SDG winter school in Senegal!

**UP**, in collaboration with <u>Lecturers Without Borders</u> and <u>HOME</u> <u>Association</u> (two NGOs founded by UP staff and students) is organizing a winter school in Thiès, Senegal, in which local students use the Makerspace in the École Polytechnique de Thiès to design and prototype solutions to local challenges related to the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

This event started on Sunday, Nov 6th, with a hybrid event with invited

speakers from 4 countries and students joining in person from 2 cities in Senegal. The practical activities of the winter school will begin on **December 5th**.



### Roundtables with HEI staff and with communities (UCL)

In November, HEIDI's **UCL** team is holding three roundtables on "**Understanding Digital Action**". We are inviting anyone who either works at an HEI (Higher Education Institution), or in a voluntary organisation or community group, who is interested in organising Digital Action activities - or for whom organising such activities is part of your job - to join us. These roundtables are designed to bring together people interested in these groups, members of them, or staff who work in different roles and in different faculties across HEIs, to contribute their thoughts and experiences. Over the one hour sessions we will explore your stories, hopes, challenges and what you have observed about the needs and requirements of participants in and

organisers of Digital Action events, whether these are part of your work or a day-to-day voluntary activity.
